Landscaping will take the student into the professional world of landscaping with an overview of managing clients, developing garden plans, budgeting with some practical experience in a professionally landscaped garden.

The syllabus is a general guideline. Projects, skill goals and order may be changed to better suit the skill level of a particular student. Each student will be required to finish an individual or group project before the end of the semester.

Attendance / Tardy Policy/COVID and Illness Policy

Your student's attendance and participation in class are required. Illness and pre-approved absences, family emergencies and weather or pandemic related closures will be excused.
