Class Description

Students will experiment with weaving, knitting and dyeing the first 3 weeks and choose a final project the 4th week. Using one of the prior skills. Students will be responsible for providing their materials and tools for the final project. A group charity project will be worked on weeks 10 and 11 and a fun Holiday piece in the last class.

This is usually a full year class but your student is welcome to join us for one or both semesters. Each semester consists of 12 sessions, each 1 hour and 20 minutes long.

Syllabus /Outline

The syllabus is a general guideline. Projects, skill goals and order may be changed to better suit the skill level of a particular class, a particular student, available mediums and supplies and weather. Each student will be required to finish an individual or group project before the end of the semester for which information will be provided in the first class. Final project pictures will be displayed in the Gallery on our website.

Semester 1 Fall 2020

- 1 (9/15/20) Intro/baseline work, student contact, hold harmless , brief powerpoint presentation on textile development throughout history. Wall paper weaving.
- 2 (9/22/20) Weaving-yarn bag, plying and tassel.

Attendance / Tardy Policy/COVID and Illness Policy

Your student's attendance and participation in class are required. Illness and pre-approved absences, family emergencies and weather or pandemic related closures will be excused. Make up work for absences in excess of two classes will be assigned if necessary. Your student is required to attend at least 80% of the classes scheduled.

Late arrivals interrupt other student's learning and will not be tolerated on an ongoing basis. If your student has a scheduling conflict and requires some flexibility, we will try to work with you but this must be discussed with and approved by Ms. Frizzo in advance.

There is a ten minute passing period. Students will be expected to assist in clean up and respect the class schedule. All students should endeavor to arrive on time, ready to learn. All students will leave their coats and bags in the entryway. Separate hooks are provided. Shoes will be removed or sanitized at the door. Students will then be required to wash their hands prior to the start of class and again at the end of class. Students will not share supplies and will have a designated place to put their supplies. The classroom will be sanitized by the teacher in between each class.
