Class Description

Class is designed to leave the student with a more professional approach to teaching arts and crafts to viable market including resume and business plans, financial responsibilities, legalities, interview skills and importance of art education. The student will leave with a completed lesson plan and a basic idea as to how to prepare a viable project for a specific audience.

SYLLABUS/OUTLINE

Semester 1

1. Interview and set purpose. choose subject matter, site options, student age, Srs., and budget. Target audience, legalities.
2. Assess previous experiences and determine details on previous "interview"
3. Work on site and budget. A marketing plan. (Club, Church, family, party, studio, show)
4. Start to outline the actual craft process, materials list and travel issues
5. Outline and create lesson plan that includes art theory
6. Work up the project by self
7. Finalize the teaching/lesson plan. set up a "kit"
8. Work up project with single student
9. Contact facility/club etc.marketing, Prepare appropriate resume set up visit/interview
10. Interview. prep for group
11. Teach a class

12. Bonus. project in a box for gift

SEMESTER II

1. Interview and discuss fall semester
2. Review historic teaching styles, discipline, legalities craft styles, Ethnic trends. Optional teaching methods/ on line etc
3. Kits.....for invalids, shut ins, age appropriate, subject matter. Craft shows, art galleries, where to get ideas, ethics
4. Select a project
5. Budget plan and marketing
6. Practice project by self
7. Practice teaching project to one student
8. Market
9. Purchase supplies and package
10. Teach as planned
11. Botanical drawing simplified

Attendance / Tardy Policy/COVID and Illness Policy

Your student's attendance and participation in class are required. Illness and pre-approved absences, family emergencies and weather or pandemic related closures will be excused. Make up work for absences in excess of two classes will be assigned if necessary. Your student is required to attend at least 80% of the classes scheduled.

The classroom will be sanitized by the teacher in between each class.
